
OUTDOOR WATER USAGE—MAY 1-OCT 31

To ensure compliance with the Bylaw, enforcement may occur through:

- Reports made to the Village Office
- Observations by staff of watering on non-permitted days or times
- Utility usage data logs

An individual found violating the bylaw may be subject to a \$500 penalty.

2025 PROPERTY TAXES

Property tax notices have been sent. Taxes are due December 31, 2025, BUT Pay by July 31 & get a 10% discount on the municipal portion!

Payment options to suit your style include:

- Online banking—payments can take 3-5 business days to be processed by the bank so ensure plenty of time before the due date)
- Cheque—mail it or drop it in our after-hours slot at the office front door (keep an eye out for any postal delays)

SIT, STAY, KNOW THE ANIMAL CONTROL BYLAW!

Hey, animal lovers! We know your pet is your best friend, but just like humans, our furry companions need to follow a few important rules. Let's be *purr-fectly* clear about our Animal Control Bylaw—it's all about keeping pets safe and neighbours happy! So, let's chat about the Bylaw to make sure you and your pet stay on the right paw.

- ⇒ License Your Dog—All dogs need to be licensed! For just \$25, you get a lifetime license—quick, easy, and it helps ensure your dog can be returned to you safely if they ever go missing. Dogs found running at large may be impounded, and fees can apply. With a license, you get a free pass the first time—because let's be honest, some pups are just expert escape artists!
- ⇒ Max 3 dogs per household
- ⇒ **Leash it Up**—Dogs must be on a leash, not to exceed 6.5 feet, in public spaces, except in the designated Dog Park. This area is perfect for your pup to run free, but make sure they're well-behaved!
- ⇒ No excessive barking—Talk to your dog as the owner must take all measures to prevent any nuisance behaviour
- ⇒ Cats Do Not Require a License—they must wear an identification tag on a collar when off their property though
- ⇒ **Dog Park**—We love seeing responsible pet parents picking up after their pups at the Dog Park –Thank You! But lately...those freshly stocked poop bags are vanishing faster than a treat in a dog's mouth.

Here's the Scoop:

- ⇒ These bags are for everyone to use during park visits
- ⇒ Taking the whole roll means others go without
- ⇒ If this keeps up, the Village may not be able to keep providing them

Let's keep it paws-itive:

- ⇒ Take only what you need –not the whole stash
- ⇒ Leave some for your fellow dog lovers
- ⇒ Be a team player at the dog park!
