HYDRANT FLUSHING-OCT 2 & 3

Hydrant flushing is the quick release of water from fire hydrants – a controlled procedure that is vital to the general maintenance of our water distribution system & ensures you have access to clean, safe drinking water. It also ensures hydrants are operating effectively in case of an emergency. Residents may experience reduced water pressure or temporary discoloration of the water while the work is being conducted. This rust-colored appearance is the iron & mineral deposits in the water that get stirred up. The water doesn't pose any health risk, but it may stain laundry. Please limit water use during the hours of 8 am–4pm & run your taps after the hydrant flushing has subsided in your area to help wash away any residual particles that may have entered your water line—run until it's clear. We thank you for your patience & cooperation while we work to keep our water supply safe & reliable!

THNKING OF RUNNING FOR MUNICIPAL COUNCIL?

- \Rightarrow At least 18 years old on day of election
- \Rightarrow A Canadian citizen at time of nomination paper submission
- ⇒ Resided in Saskatchewan for at least 6 consecutive months & resided in the Village for at least 3 consecutive months before nomination paper submission

CURB STOP PROJECT

The Village crew is undertaking a curb stop project to map all curb stops located within the Village to ensure every property's curb stop can be easily accessed by any employee of the Village in an emergency.

While the crew is going around, they will also be checking for any repairs that may be needed.

So....What is a Curb Stop & Why is This Project Important ?

A curb stop controls the water running to a home or building from the Village's water main. The exact location of a curb stop can vary, but is generally positioned at or very near the property line, which is the boundary between the Village right-of-way & private property. It is used to turn on and off the water supply between the Village's drinking water distribution system & your home. Curb stops are owned by the Village and can only be operated by a Village employee.

Common Reasons to Turn Off Water from the Curb Stop

- An emergency such as a flood or back up in your home
- Repair or replace the main shutoff valve in your home
- Repairing or replacing you water line
- Home renovations & repairing water leaks in your home

This is Where Your Help is Required!

Keep Your Curb Stop Clear & Visible

It is important that a curb stop is functional, visible and accessible. The ease of access is for shutting off water during emergencies, conducting maintenance, making repairs, or turning water service on or off for a property.

Property owners are responsible for ensuring the curb stop remains accessible by ensuring landscaping/driveways, etc. stay within private property and clear of the curb stop.

- \Rightarrow Make sure any landscaping, décor and/or vehicles don't block the curb stop
- \Rightarrow Ensure new driveways are not poured overtop the curb stop
- \Rightarrow Take care not to damage the curb stop when maintaining your property

We are asking for your assistance if you know the location of your curb stop, to please email admin@buenavista.ca with a picture of it with a notable landmark or visit us at the office for a flag to place beside the curb stop. Once our crew has been around, the flag will be removed. We thank you for your assistance in helping us get this project completed. (Seasonal residents who turn their water on and off every year have been marked)
