ATVS & DIRT Bikes—Know Where You Can Ride

We love outdoor fun but not when it damages public spaces or puts others at risk.

Whether you're riding an ATV or dirt bike (yes, in Saskatchewan, dirt bikes are classified as ATVs), here's what you need to know:

YOU MAY NOT RIDE:

- ⇒ In parks or green spaces
- ⇒ On the old railbed (walking path) or any Crown land inside the Village
- ⇒ On private land without the owner's consent

These areas are for people, not power sports.

YOU MAY RIDE:

- ⇒ On Village streets between 7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m.
- ⇒ If the ATV is insured
- ⇒ If you follow all traffic laws—stop signs, speed limits & more
- ⇒ While wearing a helmet, unless in an enclosed ATV with seatbelts & ROPS (rollover protection)

RULES FROM THE ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES ACT:

- ⇒ Must be 16 years old to operate alone, or 12+ with supervision & ATV safety certification
- ⇒ No passengers unless your ATV is designed to carry more than one rider
- ⇒ No sidewalk, ditch, or boulevard riding in a municipality

Golf Cart Rules You Need to Know

KEY RULES BASED ON SGI & LOCAL BYLAW:

- ⇒ Must be a seat for each passenger
- ⇒ Obey all traffic laws—must be operated in accordance with the rules of the road
- ⇒ Never drink & drive—federal & provincial impaired driving laws apply
- ⇒ Maximum speed of 24 km/hr on level ground
- ⇒ No driving on provincial highway other than to cross one
- ⇒ Daylight hours only—half hour before sunrise to half hour after sunset
- ⇒ Owner must carry a minimum of \$200,000 in 3rd party liability insurance
- ⇒ Minimum Class 7 driver's license required to operate
- ⇒ Slow Moving Sign must be displayed on the rear, as near to the center as practicable
- ⇒ Cannot operate on any roadway with a posted speed over 50 km/hr
